

# **Bee Aware!**

#### **Medication**

- ✓ There may be children in this classroom who receive "Emergency Medication" on an on-going basis, as needed.
- ✓ EPI- PEN or Asthma Inhalers can be found with the campus nurse and may be in the classroom in a locked storage area. Medication is stored out of children's reach and cabinet locked at the end of the day.
- ✓ The classroom teacher has been trained to administer medication in case of emergency. This
  person is designated to take on field trips or outside play as needed and will replace in cabinet
  when return. The school nurse is available on campus, as needed.

### <u>Allergies</u>

✓ Children with FOOD ALLERGIES or SPECIAL DIET may be present in the classroom. Check allergy list on the BEE AWARE! poster in the classroom before serving food. Poster is also available in the cafeteria. Additional details can be found in the child file.

Mouth	Itching and swelling of the mouth, lips and/or tongue
Throat	Itching and/or a sense of lightness in the throat, hoarseness and coughing
Skin	Hives, itchy rash and/or swelling of the face or extremities
Stomach	Nausea, abdominal cramps, vomiting and/or diarrhea
Lung	Shortness of breath, repetitive coughing and/or wheezing
Heart	Weak pulse and/or "passing out"

- React Quickly
- Call School Nurse
- Call 9-1-1
